• A Beginners Block course will be run on Thursdays at 7 pm. Cost is \$40 for eight weeks. A minimum of 6 paying people is required before we can start. Partners not necessary.

• Club Champs are on Saturday 8th August starting at 6 pm. Cost members - Adult \$10, Child \$5; Non-member - Adult \$12, Child \$7

Categories are:

1. Diamond (60 years+)
 2. Masters (50 years+)
 3. Golden (40 years+)
 4. Platinum (30 years+)
 5. Open (18 years+)
 6. Open restricted (18 years +)
 7. Senior Restricted (40 years +)
 8. Junior same Sex (under 18 years)
 9. Senior same Sex (18 years+)
 10. Unders & Overs (1 dancer 18 over yrs; 1 dancer under 18 years)
 11. Social Triples (2 of the three have never danced in a competition)
 12. Junior Triples (all dancers are 18 years under)
 13. Senior Triples (all dancer are 18 years+)
 14. Novice 1 (both dancers have never danced in a competition before)
 15. Novice 2 (1 experienced dancer + 1 novice dancer)
 16. ***New***Teams Event (must be 2 couples or more and maybe any mixture of age and gender- Club to pick song)
 17. Senior & Junior Invitation (not a Wanganui RnR Club Member but financial with any other RnR Club)
 18. Best Dressed - couple, lady, man, junior couple, girl, boy (please note if you are being assessed you must dance in the shoes you wear for best dressed)
- Note: All dancers must be financial members; Dancers may dance in more than 1 category; Dancers may dance down e.g. a 50 year old can dance in the open category however unless stated senior dancer cannot dance in Junior category or vice versa.
