Stay a couple of nights to soak up the atmosphere in 2011.

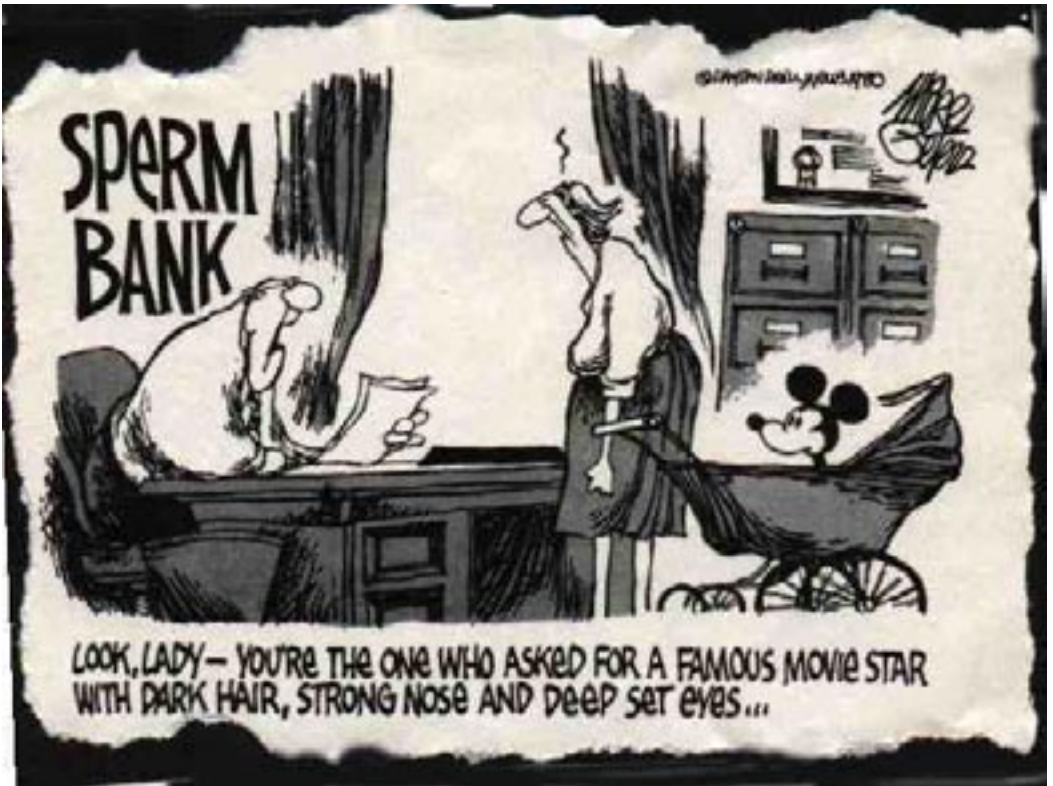

New Plymouth 21-2-09

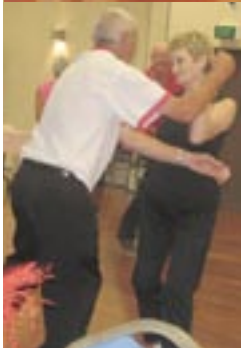
